INFORME DEL VIAJE DE TRABAJO DE UNA DELEGACIÓN DE LA COMISIÓN DE INTERIOR AL PARLAMENTO EUROPEO (27 de febrero de 2018)

A invitación del Parlamento Europeo, y para asistir a una sesión conjunta de la Comisión de Libertades Civiles, Justicia y Asuntos de Interior de dicha Cámara junto con dos representantes de cada Cámara de los Parlamentos Nacionales, una delegación del Congreso de los Diputados integrada por delegación del Presidente en el Diputado D. José Alberto Martín-Toledano Suárez y, según turno rotatorio, el Diputado D. David Serrada Pariente, se desplazó a Bruselas y, en el mismo día, retornó de Bruselas a Madrid, con la finalidad de participar en la citada reunión, junto con una delegación del Senado.

La finalidad de la reunión interparlamentaria era tratar los pactos globales de la ONU sobre refugiados y migrantes y el papel de los Parlamentos Nacionales.

En efecto, la Declaración de Nueva York sobre Refugiados y Migrantes de la Asamblea General de Naciones Unidas de septiembre de 2016, en la que participó el Parlamento Europeo, estipulaba en dos anexos que se iban a efectuar consultas con los Estados y otros interesados con la finalidad de que, en 2018 se puedan aprobar dos pactos globales sobre, respectivamente **pacto global sobre refugiados (GCR acrónimo en inglés)** como marco integral de respuesta a refugiados; y, **pacto global para una migración segura, ordenada y regular (GCM, acrónimo en inglés)**, respecto de los principios, directrices y compromisos sobre el trato a los migrantes en situaciones de vulnerabilidad como procesos diferentes aunque vinculados.

ACNUR propondrá a fines de 2018 un texto final sobre el GCR que posteriormente será adoptado por la Asamblea General de la ONU. En lo referente al GCM las conversaciones se están desarrollando mediante negociaciones de carácter intergubernamental, presididas por dos facilitadores de Naciones Unidas de México y Suiza. Bajo la supervisión del Secretario General de la ONU y con el apoyo técnico de la OIM. En 2018 y bajo la presidencia de Dña. Louise Arbour, tendrá lugar la Conferencia Intergubernamental sobre migración internacional. El Secretario General de Naciones Unidas presentó en febrero de 2018 un “borrador cero” del GCM, actualmente en fase de negociación y que está previsto que se pueda adoptar en Marruecos en diciembre de 2018.

La reunión interparlamentaria, Comisión LIBE del Parlamento Europeo y representantes de Parlamentos Nacionales, tiene por finalidad debatir conjuntamente los pactos globales de la ONU, intercambiar criterios entre los Parlamentos Nacionales y el Parlamento Europeo y, reforzar el papel de los Parlamentos en este proceso, asimismo es relevante para la posición del pleno del Parlamento Europeo que se presume se adoptará en marzo.



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Participan en esta reunión también representantes de agencias de la ONU, los co-facilitadores, el SEAE, la Comisión Europea, la Presidencia del Consejo, y representantes de la sociedad civil.

La reunión, tras la apertura con intervenciones de D. Claude Moraes, Presidente de la Comisión LIBE del Parlamento Europeo, y la Sra. Christea, Presidenta de la Comisión de Asuntos Exteriores del Parlamento de Bulgaria, y del Comisario Avramopoulos, se organiza en tres sesiones:

Primera sesión sobre el Pacto global sobre refugiados, en la que intervienen por la Mesa el Sr. Türk, representante de ACNUR, el Sr. Nieto en representación de la Comisión Europea, la Sra. Papadopoulou, funcionaria de alto nivel del Consejo Europeo de Refugiados y Exilados (ECRE), el Padre Fabio Baggio en representación de migraciones y refugiados de la Iglesia católica, y Dña. Roberta Metsola y Dña. Cecilia Kyenge co-ponentes del Informe sobre la necesidad de un enfoque comunitario holístico de la migración.

A continuación, en turno de eurodiputados y diputados nacionales participan las siguientes personas: Sra. Saugar del Parlamento Húngaro; Sra. Stamatakí del Parlamento Helénico; Sra. Jiménez Becerril, eurodiputada; Sra. Jones, Cámara de los Comunes del Reino Unido; Sra. Gomes, eurodiputada; Sr. Bussutil, Parlamento Maltés; Sr Pérez Lapazaran, senador, Parlamento Español, quien indica que España es el tercer país receptor de personas indocumentadas procedentes de África, Venezuela, Siria y Colombia, siendo el enfoque español combinar responsabilidad y solidaridad, implicarse en el esfuerzo como también ha dicho, afirma, el padre Baggio. Intervienen seguidamente una representante del Parlamento Polaco, el Sr. Kurzepa; El Sr. Hebner del Parlamento Alemán; el diputado español Martín-Toledano quien matiza la necesidad de no confundir migración con derecho de asilo, pues no es procedente considerar solicitante de asilo al migrante económico o por razones medioambientales; aduce el diputado que se debería ir a la raíz de los problemas, a las causas, muchas veces basadas en la inestabilidad política, y reclamar solidaridad europea y, de otra parte, estudiar la fórmula adecuada de sanción penal a quienes vulneran los derechos de los migrantes. Intervino a continuación un diputado del Parlamento Noruego, el Sr. Gharahkhani; seguidamente intervino la Sra. Pfundtner, del Parlamento Eslovaco; y finalizó este turno con el diputado de Letonia, Sr. Spolitis.

Segunda sesión sobre los pactos globales para una migración segura, ordenada y regular (GCM), celebrada a continuación, comenzó con la intervención por la Mesa de los dos co-facilitadores de las consultas y negociaciones intergubernamentales en materias relacionadas con el pacto global para una migración segura, ordenada y regular de la ONU, Sr. Gómez Camacho, embajador representante permanente de México ante ONU en Nueva York, y Sr. Jürg Lauber, embajador representante permanente de Suiza ante ONU en Nueva York.

A continuación intervino el Sr. Jonathan Prentice, jefe de gabinete de la Sra. Arbour y representante especial del Secretario General de IOM. Seguidamente el Sr. Eugenio



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Ambrosi, director regional para la Unión Europea de la IOM; Sr Hristo Simeanov, co-presidente del grupo de trabajo de alto nivel del Consejo de la Unión Europea durante la presidencia búlgara. Seguidamente, intervienen dos diputadas de Parlamentos Nacionales que expresan la posición de sus respectivos Parlamentos, la Sra. Ferm por Suecia y la Sra. Constanza Urbano da Sousa por la Asamblea de la República Portuguesa.

En turno de eurodiputados intervienen la eurodiputada española Sra. Valenciano, quien en su intervención se refirió a una propuesta conjunta de resolución del Sr. Díaz de Mera y ella misma, de 5 de abril del 17, que fue aprobada, sobre Servicio Exterior, en la que pedían el reforzamiento de la política internacional europea en materia de mediación y reforzamiento del papel conjunto de Europa.

Seguidamente, intervinieron por los Parlamentos Nacionales, la Sra. Stamatakis del Parlamento Griego; el senador español, Sr. Pérez Lapazarán quien expresó su acuerdo con el pacto global sobre migración segura, ordenada y regular, de modo que su posición podría resumirse en: regularizar, abrir y controlar. A continuación, intervino el eurodiputado español Sr. López Aguilar quien felicitó a los panelistas, se refirió a la necesaria respuesta global que requiere cambios de mentalidad, para considerar positiva la migración, y a necesarios cambios, también, legislativos. A continuación, el diputado español Sr Martín-Toledano adujo su parecer favorable a una migración, segura, ordenada y regular; reiterando la relevancia del trabajo de desarrollo en origen, los retornos ordenados, y el análisis sobre sanciones penales y económicas a las mafias, en suma: ordenar para evitar la tentación del populismo al respecto. Intervino por Alemania el diputado Sr. Stuh; la eurodiputada Sra. Gómez; el diputado húngaro Sr. Csenger-Zalan y la Sra. Pfundtner por Eslovaquia.

Tercera sesión de clausura con intervenciones de la Directora General de Derechos Humanos, Asuntos Globales y Multilaterales del SEAE, Sra. Knudsen; y las observaciones del Presidente de la Comisión LIBE, Sr. Moraes y de la Sra Suika, Vicepresidenta de la Comisión AFET, finalizó la jornada.

BACKGROUND NOTE

The New York Declaration for Refugees and Migrants¹, adopted by the United Nations General Assembly in September 2016, is a milestone for global solidarity with refugees and migrants, containing a set of principles and commitments to enhance the protection of Refugees and Migrants.

The New York Declaration provided in two annexes that negotiations in consultation with States and other stakeholders would follow. These negotiations and consultations aims at the adoption of two global compacts in 2018:

- A Global Compact on refugees (GCR) (including the development of the so-called "Comprehensive refugee response framework", CRRF) targeting to achieve a more equitable sharing of the burden and responsibility for hosting and supporting the world's refugees;
- A Global Compact for safe, orderly and regular migration (GCM) targeting to develop principles, commitments and guidelines on the treatment of migrants in vulnerable situations;

These two processes are "separate, distinct and independent", although very much related.

The UN High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) was tasked to develop the practical aspects of the Global Compact on refugees. A final text of the Global Compact on Refugees will be proposed by the UN High Commissioner for Refugees for adoption by the UN General Assembly in 2018. The aim is to achieve a more equitable sharing of the burden and responsibility for hosting and supporting the world's refugees. A 'zero draft' of the global compact on refugees was released on 31st January². This 'Zero draft' provides the basis for the discussions, ahead of formal talks with UN Member States in Geneva, which began in February.

The discussions for the Global Compact for safe, orderly and regular migration are conducted through intergovernmental negotiations³, chaired by the 2 co-facilitators (Mexico and Switzerland), while the UN Secretary General is responsible to provide appropriate support for the negotiations while the International Organization for Migration (IOM) provides the technical and policy expertise. In spring 2017, the UN Secretary-General appointed Louise Arbour as his Special Representative for International Migration who will be also the Secretary-General of the intergovernmental conference on international migration to be held in 2018.

On 11 January 2018, the UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres presented his report "Making Migration Work for All"⁴, as an input to the zero draft of the global compact for safe, orderly and regular migration and related intergovernmental negotiations. On 5th

February 2018, a 'Zero draft' of the GCM⁵ was presented to UN Member States. The final negotiation phase will follow from February to July 2018 with the aim of submitting the GCM, during the 72nd session of the UN General Assembly, to the Intergovernmental Conference for adoption in December 2018 in Morocco.

The European Parliament has paid great attention to the processes leading to the Global Compacts, acknowledging that it represents a historical opportunity for achieving a range of principles and commitments regarding international migration in all its dimensions.

Already in September 2016, the European Parliament participated at the Summit for Refugees and Migrants⁶, which adopted the New York Declaration. In particular, the LIBE Committee⁷ adopted a set of actions⁸ aiming for an active involvement and contribution to the process leading to the Global Compacts. Since then, different meetings of the LIBE Committee have been dedicated to the Global Compacts in cooperation with other interested Committees.

The inter-parliamentary Committee meeting ("The UN Global Compacts on refugees and migrants: the role of Parliaments") which is to take place on 27 February in the afternoon, aims at bringing together Members of the National Parliaments and the European Parliament to discuss about the content of the UN Global Compacts. Furthermore, in this significant final stage of the process, this meeting will provide the occasion for in-depth exchange on the positions of the different Member States and to foster the role of parliaments in this process. Finally, the inter-parliamentary committee intends to strengthen the parliamentary dimension of the EU position and to support the work of the EEAS and of the Member States in the final phase of the process leading to the adoption of the Compacts. The outcome of the conference will also contribute to develop an EP perspective on the negotiations, which will materialize in a plenary resolution to be adopted in March.

The UN agencies, the co-facilitators, the EEAS, the European Commission, the Council Presidency and different stakeholders from the civil society have been invited to participate into the discussions.


