Visitor information

Estonia is in the Eastern European Time (EET) zone (UTC+2). The currency used is the Euro (EUR). The standard voltage is 230 V with a frequency of 50 Hz, and power plugs and sockets are Type F. In April, the weather in Estonia is typically cool, with average temperatures ranging from 2°C at night to 13°C during the day.
